1825

The Right Honble
Lord Viscount Melville R. J. General

Government with whom I had personally
 communicated on the subject.

I am very sorry to hear that
 you too are limping; I am worse than limping
 on both feet to the great dismay of my numerous
 visitors at the Home Guards who really seem
 to grudge me this quick fit, of the Gout.

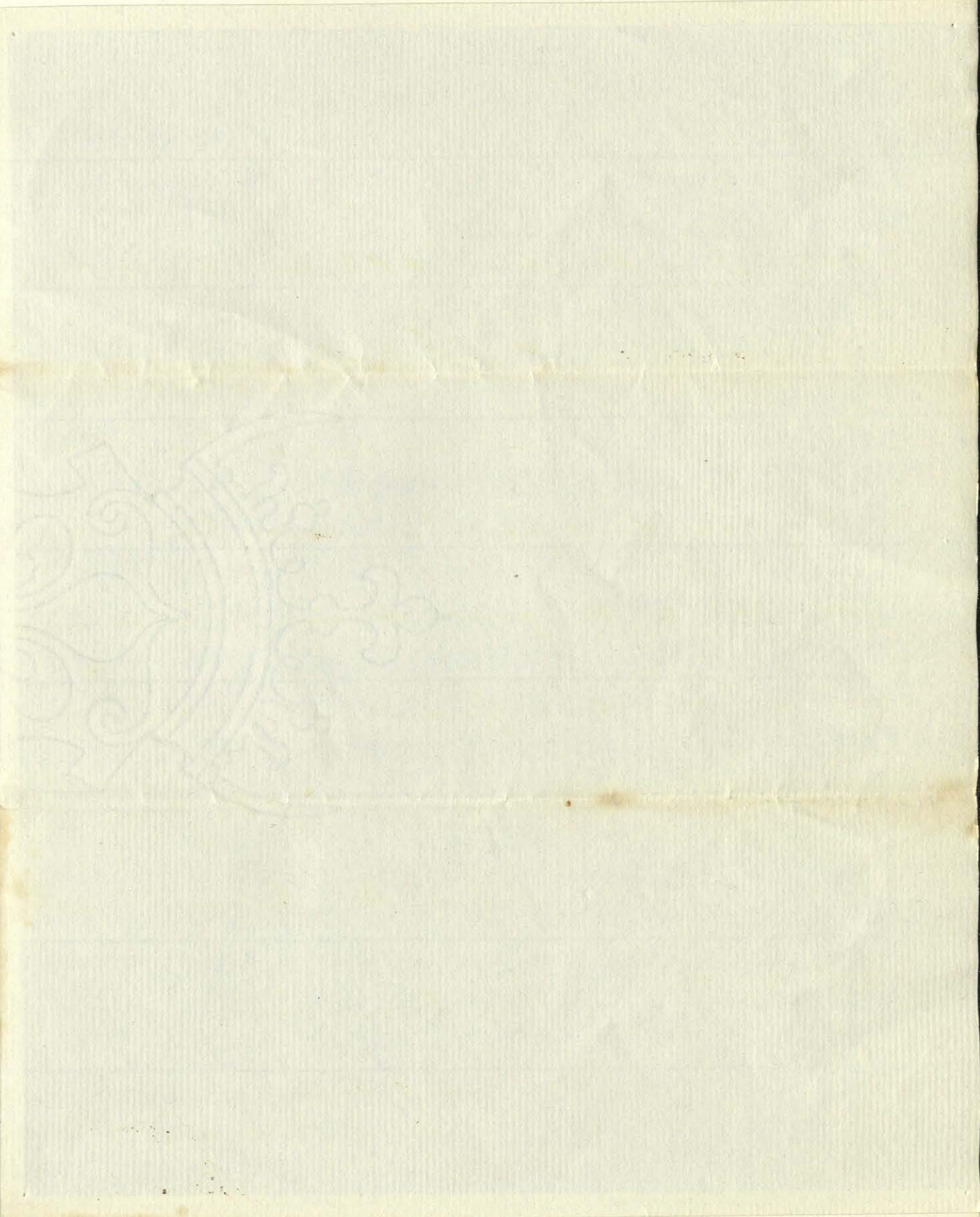
