The Weather has of late been so changeable, as very much to retard the getting in of the Hay - though but a small Part of it has at present been materially injured - At this Time, the Watered Meadows and the Great Meadow are standing, & about 20 Acres of the Temple Meadow ~~is~~ not carried. The Mowers are ^{at work, or not,} ~~not~~ according to the Weather will allow -

About five Acres of the Home Piece have been planted with Cabbage - about 1 1/2 Acres is in Parsnips, and the Remainder of the Field, (14 1/2 Acres,) is sown with Turneps and Cole - as also 9 A. or Smiths' Lawn, and Meadow Slaw Hill, fourteen Acres -

On Monday last 79 of the best of the Shrub Hill Sheep were drawn ~~from the~~ off, and turned into the Park for fattening - and on the following Day, the same Number ~~of the~~ ~~selected from the~~ of the smallest Wethers was selected from the Tag Flock, to fill up the Place of those taken from Shrub Hill -
