at first making Herow less irritable
but some that half hour or less—
very angry irascible & high— Dr.
Barber you see used melancholy
account, the visit did not last five
minutes as he was violent again
Dr. Phillips, Dr. Barber told the D. that
He was in appearance civil with
him but anger agitated him
was surprised, for he had not
forgiven what he had said yester-
day that within the last hour, since
the Physician had been in, he had
calmed, & as a proof of it had worked
to bestow which he found him-
self too unquiet in the morning to
agree to yet Dr. so. was of opinion
that the Garrison was not at
its height, having told me when
