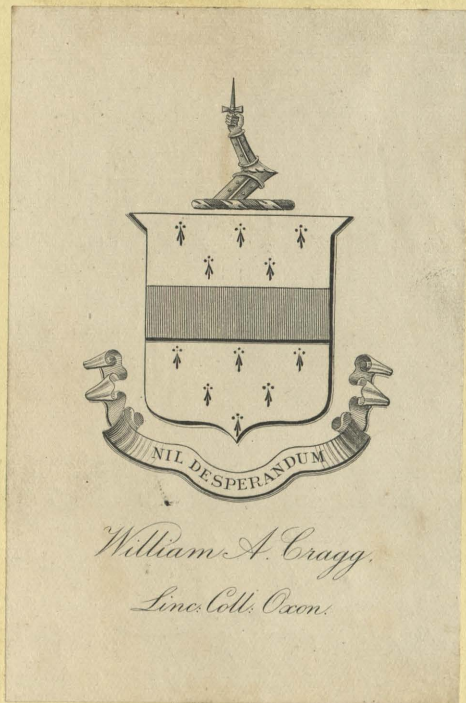

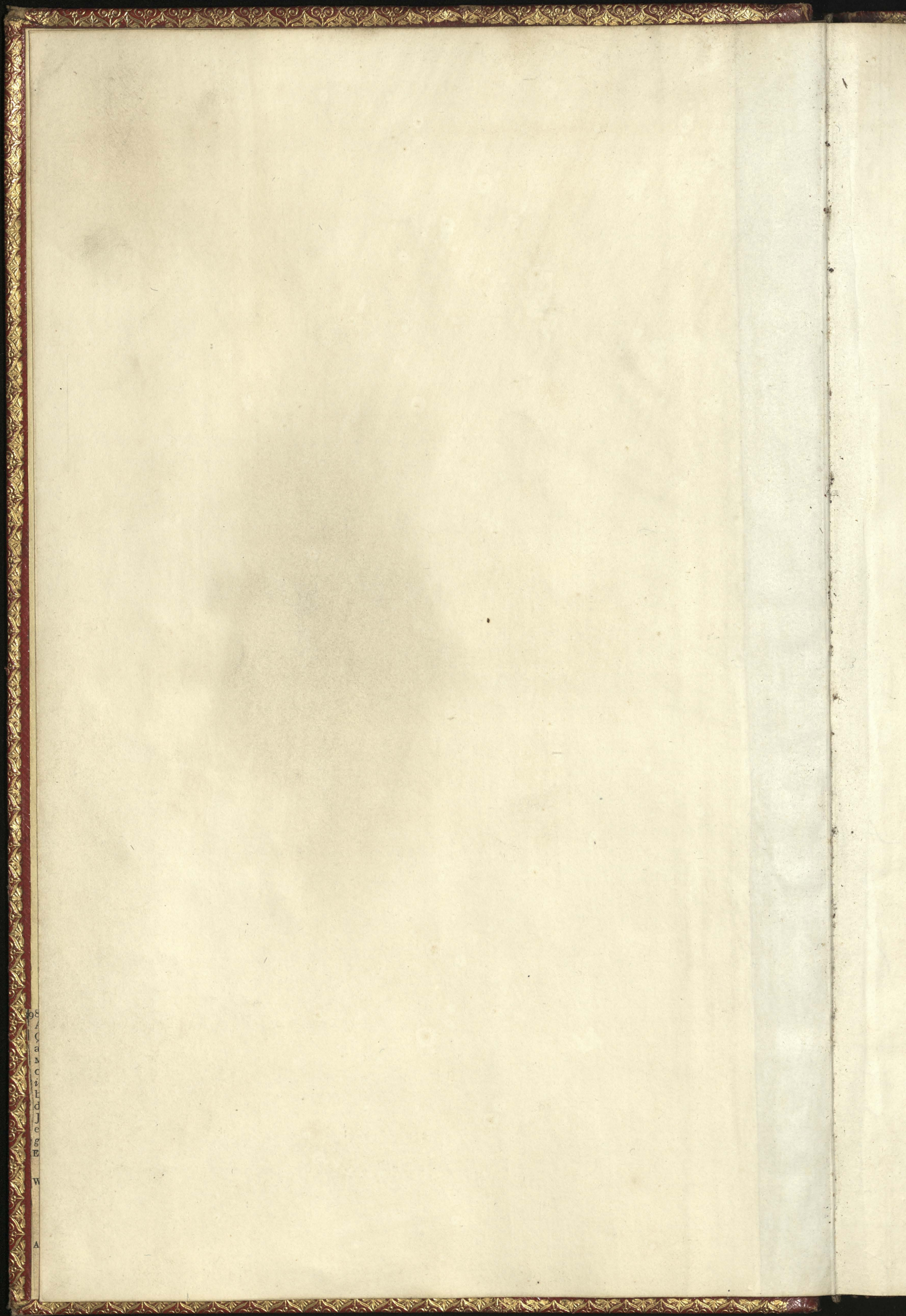
Extraordinary little seems to be on record as to this Princess, who died unmarried aged 72. Her only recorded striking virtue was that she was "patient."

When she died she seems to have had £126 in the Bank, and £11 3s. 6d. in hand. She had to keep up Clarence House and Frogmore, and we see what she paid her servants, who they were; the price paid by the King of Hanover for the Princess's books; the sum received for the Princess's interest in Frogmore House, for her Furniture, Wines, etc.

Among the items we note "Venison, £2 2s." "Turtle, £1 1s." "Soda-Water, £5 19s." "Silk Mercer's Bill, £476" "The Last Doctor's Bill, Colnaghi, Printseller, £42; Venables artist, £57; Sams, bookseller £113; Mrs. Hall, dressmaker's bill; Hairdresser (Brewster's Bill); Cash paid Sir W. Newton for Miniature.
