I sh^d be to signify unto your Grace
his Majestys pleasure, that you provide and
deliver to the hon^{ble} Grey Wainard Esq^r Geom^r
of his Majestys Removing Wardrobe, the follow^{ing}
particulars for his Maj^{ty} Service at St. Jamies viz^t
a Standing Bed compleat the Furniture of a
Crimson Camblett Lind with a green Thread Sattin
& laced Suitab^l, and a Compleat Set of Bedding,
Three pair of Window Curtains and Vallance
Six back chairs, one Easy chair, and one Drifing
chair, all stuff and cover'd the same as the Bed
and laced Suitab^l, wth false cases of Crimson
paragon to the Chairs. Twelve bending back
wallnuttree chairs wth matted bottoms. One
four post field Bed wth Crimson Harateen furnit^r
and laced Suitab^l & a compleat Set of Bedding
one Table Bedstead and Bedding. And for so
doing this shall be your Graces Warr. Given
under my hand this 7th day of March 1722 in the
Seventh Year of his Maj^{ty} Reign.
