giving where as in Consideration of the due Love and Affection which we bear towards our Queen Elizabeth
dearly beloved Countess and for the better Support of her Royal Estate we were Graciously pleased to Grant
and Allow unto her a sum of money or yearly Pension of forty Thousand Pounds of Lawful money of
Great Britain to be due and payable annually at the Receipt of our Exchequer out of our
Crown and Received Now know ye that of our especial Grace certain knowledge and under Assertion
have Given and Granted and by these presents to her and her Heirs our said most dearly beloved
Countess Queen Elizabeth a yearly sum of money or Pension of Ten Thousand Pounds of Lawful money of

Great Britain in addition to our said former Grant of Sixty Thousand Pounds by the Year to be sent to Committee from the fifth day of July
One Thousand seven hundred and sixty two and from thence to be payable and paid quarterly by four Days and Equal Portions at the
Receipt of our Exchequer at Westminster at the several Days of Payment in the Year out of any our Treasure or Revenue that shall from time
to time be and remain there applicable to the Use of our Civil Government the first Quarterly payment of Two Thousand Five Hundred
Pounds to be issued and paid on the tenth day of October following to our said most Dearly
beloved Consort the said yearly sum of Two Thousand Pounds in manner aforesaid during our Royal pleasure And whereas
it is required and commanded by Commission of our Treasury or any Clerk or more officers and our Right Treasurer Councillor
and Under Treasurer of our Exchequer for the time being called to cause to be sent further yearly sum of Sixty thousand Pounds of our
Two Thousand Pounds to be issued and Applied in manner aforesaid to our said most Dearly beloved Consort or to our Treasurer for the
same sum for her use and charge our Letter Patent or the Rollment or exemplification thereof to be delivered to him or his
successors in office or to our Treasurer witness his Receipt or Receipt of any sum or sum of money in pursuance of
this our Grant shall be good and sufficient Discharge for the payment thereof And whereas by direction and Grant that shall be given
shall be allowed upon the respective account or accounts of such Officer or Officers paying the same without any further or other warrant
or direction to be laid or obtained before or from our Commissioners of our Treasury or our Right Treasurer for the time being or
otherwise howsoever And whereas further here and command that our Commissioners of our Treasury or our Right Treasurer
Councillor and Under Treasurer of our Exchequer now and for the time being and all other our Officers and Clerks to whom it
shall or may appear any sum will be as often as it shall be desired by our said most Dearly beloved Consort or by our Treasurer do
or cause to be done any other thing for the use and best payment of the said yearly sum of Sixty thousand Pounds or
Pounds or any other sum of either by drawing of Warrants or Order or by Levyng of Called or Pro or other called or otherwise
according to the true, full and certaine presentt and during the continuall of the same And lastly whereas
Grant and Desire that these our Letters Patent or the Rollment or exemplification thereof shall be good valid and effectual in law
Law to all intentes and purposes and shall be taken Construed and Judged in all our Courts and places in the most benefical
cause for the best Advantage of our said most Dearly beloved Consort according to our Royal intention and meaning herein
before expressed notwithstanding any omission, imperfection, defect, matter, cause or cause whatsoever to the contrary therof in any
wise notwithstanding any Wilness whereof we have caused these our Letters to be made patent witness Our self at Westminster
the Eleventh day of September in the second Year of our Reign.
