

Prince of Wales  
April 1799.

Thank you my dear General for your  
kind letter which I received yesterday  
and which I should have answered sooner and  
I have obtained an answer relative to the  
time when Colonel Beaumont or Mr. Beaumont  
might see the same in Warwick  
Street; but the indisposition of Lady  
Elizabeth Williams who has been at the  
point of death in consequence of having  
broken a blood vessel some few days  
back will probably make it a week  
before it will be possible for the Colonel

to view the premises, this I beg you will mention  
to him with my best compliments, & acquaint  
him, that in case his situation will admit  
if it I will take care to acquaint you  
with it. Many thanks to my dear Governor  
for your kind attention, in this, as well as  
every other occasion. I am happy to see your  
Letter dated from Camp's Court, as I like  
myself that is an indication that your  
health is quite re-established.
