Dear Greenwood

Upon the receipt of Your letter of the 10th Instant I had no time in writing to the Duke of Portland upon the subject of the poor Jew, but am sorry to inform you that I received last night his answer by which I am afraid there is no chance of saving him; As however I remain a Captain Colonel and Adjutant of the Jew Protestants, I have enclosed it immediately to the Duke of Portland what that may produce I can not tell though I am afraid this case has been fully considered and his fate is determined.

I mentioned yesterday evening to the Duke the probability of my being to go abroad the less a good deal affected though upon the whole less than I had apprehended, as he told me that he had for some days begun to suspect it from the arrangements making for Sir Ralph Abercrombie's expedition. It certainly is a hard blow upon her, and makes her regret the loss of poor Mr. Bunting more and more, as her company would have been of the greatest comfort to her.

Isaac Browning has informed me that Mr Pitt has approved of the sum proposed for my Octal as well as of the five Annals for Mr Pitt for my Octal, that I think exceedingly handsome.

I am sorry to hear that the Duke of Kent has had an attack of the Rheumatism, he ought to make use of the Gentleman sent to Windsor to enquire the Reason of his not going there as I told His Majesty of his intention of leaving Windsor on Saturday and proceeding to Plymouth on Monday
