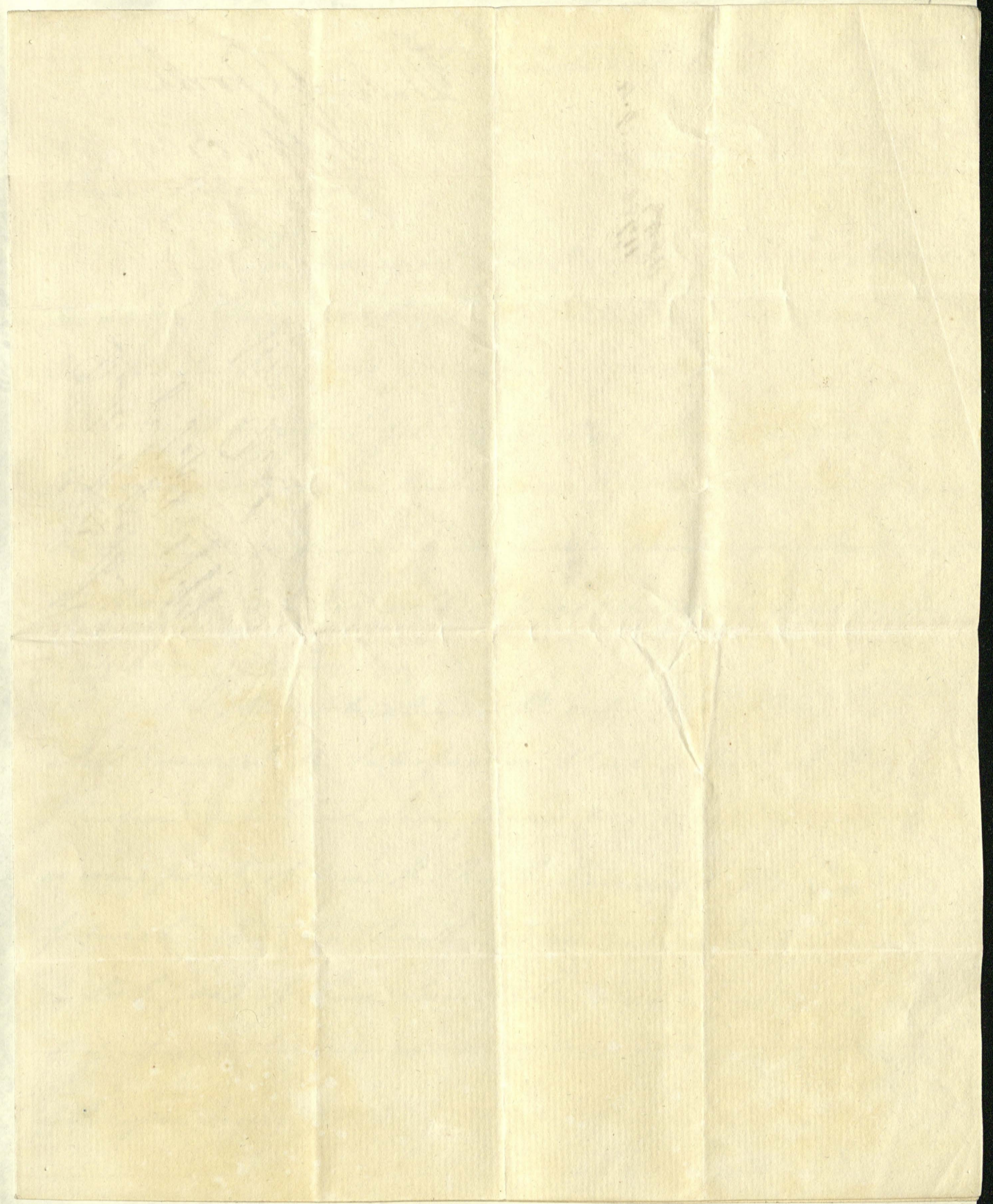

could be, and if I am successful what I certainly <sup>will</sup> not

feel upon myself completely gratified

I am anxious to get away but the Wind is contrary  
and I am afraid that I shall not be able to finish my  
business and be allowed to <sup>go on board</sup> sail till tomorrow morning
