You may be perfectly assured
that I shall in no way commit
you, but I must again say how
very sensibly I feel your kindness
all your letters are burnt.

My surprise is as great as my
disappointment, & certainly the
gross absurdity of the Reason
assigned for the Proposal is only
to be equalled by the extreme
Injustice of the Act - The late
Duke of Kent held the Govern^t
of Gibraltar & received the Emoluments

of it during sixteen years
without going out to Gibraltar
after having only visited there
some Months - and I was the
General when Duke of York was
Governor of Portsmouth.

I am quite convinced that the
Duke of York has acted with
perfect sincerity & great earnestness
on this occasion - I have also
reason to believe that Ministers
have done the same
