Dear Sir, We are thus persuaded in our
 road to Breefells we have intended we should reach
 on ^{the} 7th instant. I must remain there Sunday 18th
 to pay our respects at our banquets in addition
 to the Dutch by my two daughters my two sons and the
 two ladies accompanying the Dutch to arrive at
 one o'clock on Monday 7th instant with the Prince Charles
 of Prussia. His grace the Prince of Orange Mary and Jan.
 -tine lady anxious to see the yacht so that we shall
 embark at once and give him an early English welcome
 at four o'clock.

As for the embarkation of the Carnages I shall say no
 thing at present: they will be on board the steamer
 the Polina which will also be Dr. and Mr. Batters
 if they return with us to England. All the rest of
 our party will be on board the Jack.

Prince Charles does not go to England. On his embarking
 on board the Jack the Prussian Standard must
 be hoisted. As soon as the Netherlands sends the
 title of Count of Surost the Standard is not to be
 hoisted in the Jack till we reach the English
 coast.

I need not add how happy I shall feel myself under
 the company of the generous & brave & generous to be
 lamented and excellent friend Lord Nelson. I think
 you was right in first taking a Guard Ship and now
