Dear Sir,

I have the most positive
commands from His Majesty not to allow
any lady to go over with you in the Royal
Sovereign. I must therefore be to my great
regret request you to leave on this side
of the water Lady Harriett. But I hope
she will be heard on 2^d instant under
Princess Augusta will pay the Royal
Sovereign a visit.

And I trust you had better have the King's
Company dinner at seven o'clock as my sister

will be heard from the Dock Yard at Am.
 In the event of my being on board before the
 principal request the flag of the Lord High
 Admiral will fly and our register coming
 on board will be struck and the standard
 hoisted instead.

I have ordered the Marine Band from Wol.
 which will be the Jack for the day and the
 Bands of Green Cloth will be put on and give
 principal request has been the first at Am.

There may be about twenty of the party.

I shall be down at eleven on the instant
 at the Victualling Office to complete
 my inspection and answer the people after
 which I shall proceed to the Dock Yard

either to embark at once on board the Jack-
son near the arrival of your sister, or to accompany
her to the Royal Exchange.

The King in person and Pr. Bismarck the
Governor of the Province of Dist. proceed with
you to accompany the Duke of Wintourbury
to the country. I believe Pr. Bismarck
will attend Prince Augustus on 2^d instant
and I am remain,
