

Lansberg May 21st 1827

Sir

Though I have not the pleasure of being acquainted with you I venture to trouble you with these lines, as my Sister the Princess Auguste has informed me, that the King having graciously appointed you Captain of the Royal Sovereign in which his Majesty wishes me to sail; You are anxious to know where I propose leaving the Steam Boat in which I am to go down the Rhine My intention is to be towards eleven o'clock the 1st of June near Rotterdam, and if you could Sir be so obliging as to meet me there in the English Steam vessel I should avoid landing and embark at once on board of her. For which

case I trust we may be at Antwerp in the Evening,
 and remove into the Yacht without any inconvenience
 which gives us a few hours, should we meet with any
 unexpected delay. The King my Brother having
 expressed a wish that I may be at Greenwich
 House on the ¹⁴ 4 of June, I am of course anxious
 to obey his Commands.

I regret Sir the giving you so much trouble but
 am fearful of the fatigue of a long Journey over
 land. I will now take up no more of your time
 and remain with regard and esteem
