

Bushy House.
 Oct. 12: 1827.

Dear Sir,

I have this instant receiv-
 -ed from Mr. Barrow by the sloop of
 - yesterday announcing your safe arrival
 in Harwich Harbour after the tremendous
 gale you experienced in the night of the 11th.
 - nearly into Thursday. You were perfectly
 right in taking shelter in that port and the
 same discretion will of course guide you
 in proceeding on with the ice of Winter-
 -berg to the east of the Fatherlands. My in-
 -to may to a certain degree have saved you from
 the severity of the gale. But I have

that you are completely master of all that is
 requisite to conduct her with perfect safety
 to the Rhine Steam Boat which you will
 find in some 30 water.

I need not give you any advice as I am aware
 of your capability to conduct her in tow
 as I believe it is only your new regimen to
 carry the Royal Barge into her Port.

I still believe for to indeed I may say so
 that the gale seems to be breaking.

For the comfort of the Queen I am anxious to
 hear of your having lodged her quietly on board
 the Steamer and will thank you to give her
 the enclosed letter. I think it might be well to

but perhaps this letter may not reach you
at Harwich. I not where you are.
