Sir

It appearing by the Accounts
of Mr. Edward Bate, Purser of His
Majesty's Yacht Royal Sovereign,
that, subsequently to the Receipt
on board of the Admiralty Circular
of the 8th February 1827 which directs
that only Passengers doing duty
shall have whole allowance of
Rations, there were 512 days full
allowance issued to Passengers who,
according to notations made at
the Navy Office in the Purser's
Victualling Book, were entitled to

Captain Sir G. Boscawen Bart. K.C.B. only
Royal Sovereign Yacht
Deptford

only two thirds allowance, in
consequence of the Log Book not
stating that they did duty on board,
We have to acquaint you that we
have caused the sum of £16. 8. 10½
or the value of the difference between
whole and two thirds allowance
to these Papers to be charged
against you in the Books of this
Office.
