Sir

It has not been in my power  
to write to you before today to return  
you thanks for all the trouble you  
have already taken for me, but  
believe me I am indeed very  
much obliged to you for it I have  
had very thankful letters from  
both the Ladies & I have written  
these words through you I  
would pay the rest of seven  
real quarters which I will  
do, & which is to be by 3, how  
ever I have enclosed a draft  
for forty, for I think it may  
be a comfort to these poor  
creatures I have a little



money in hand, so they will then  
have twenty pounds returned &  
I had better send you fifty more  
next quarter, I have just had  
another letter from Elizabeth  
Luff saying she will give tuition  
Monday on Tuesday & that is  
the reason why I hurry in  
sending off this letter. I am  
unhappy she should leave the  
place so early, & have desired  
her to inform you to whom  
you are to be so kind as to pay  
the money in October for her  
She not told the name who was  
to pay it, she would not let her  
go - excuse your haste
