Sir,

Of the safe arrival of the China-  
fleet, you have already heard, of which the  
Wesley formed a part - I have been in  
Town two days only, & was much disappoint-  
ed at not finding you in London, as the  
Packets, addressed to H. R. Highness sh<sup>d</sup>.  
be taken from the E. I. House, as soon as  
they come up from the ship, in order to  
prevent their being tumbled about  
& their contents damaged - I have seen  
Mr. Gutscham on the business, & he advises

me to apply to General Hulse about it,  
as he is already apprized of it, & I purpose  
therefore to go down to his seat, at Whiteheath,  
to-morrow-morning; as I cannot receive  
an answer to this letter from Plymouth,  
until Monday, & I sh<sup>d</sup>: not wish to have  
it postponed, for so long a time. - I have  
been obliged to exceed, in number, the  
packages, tho' very little in bulk, in  
consequence of the large dimensions, stated  
in the permission, I received; which would  
have been too cumbersome & weighty - I have  
therefore divided the two, into six smaller  
ones - 3 containing China-ware - and  
3 containing lacquered-ware &c. -
