N^o 139 in a very Magnificent Black Marble Case
highly polished with a rich engine turned dial Gilt with
Steel hands and a Gilt Snake round it, the Cylinder the
Clock is in is supported by two Large ~~Large~~ Lions Modelled
from Life & a fine Chased Eagle on the top, the base of
the Clock is enriched with a Chaste frieze from the
Antique, the whole of the Ornaments particularly the lions
are Chased in the most spirited manner finished in
a very Superior Style, all the Ornaments are very strongly
Gilt or dead burnished Gold fixed upon a Stand
with a Purple wood Moulding allround covered with
Crimson Genoa Velvet & a Glass Shade over it @ 90 Guineas 9/4. 10
- 24 For cleaning a French Spring Clock name Made
a New Escapement New Catch New Base Plate to regulate
the Clock New Long Pendulum to vibrate in the Case fixing
the Clock in the Case Repairing several parts of the work . . . 5. 15. 6
- Made a New Base & Plinth to the Case of four Statuary
Marble remounted the Case on the New part refitted the
beads & ornaments in the panels in the Base & the feet on
the Plinth, Regilding the whole of the Ornaments consisting
of Two Large Sphynxes Two Bacchantean figures the Cylinder
for the Movement Six feet & a great number of Small pieces
of Ornament @ 36 Guineas 37. 16

Mar 24 For taking the glass to pieces & mounting it again 10. 6

For altering the stand working it thinner to fit the glass
putting a purple wood moulding all round the front
& sides & covering it with crimson velvet 2. 18. 6

24. For cleaning a very large Astronomical Clock with three
dials name LePine that shows the rising & setting of the
Sun, the Moons Age, the Year, the days of the Month &
Week & the Signs of the Zodiac polished all the steel
& work & put the whole in the same state as when new 10. 10.-

For taking the case entirely to pieces repolishing all the
Marble, cleaning all the gilt ornaments as well as
possible Regilding the eight feet & mounting the case
again @ 12/6 12. 12-

For Unmounting the Large Glass Shade Made a New
case top & mounting it again the front to draw out 3. 13. 6

Made a Large Stand with a groove to fit the Shade
into very exactly with a purple wood moulding all round
steadily pinning the Clock to the stand the edge covered
with crimson Geneva velvet @ 3/6 1. 11. 6

For Winding & Keeping in order the Clocks from Janus
1807 to Lady day 1808 @ £50 7/6 7. 10-

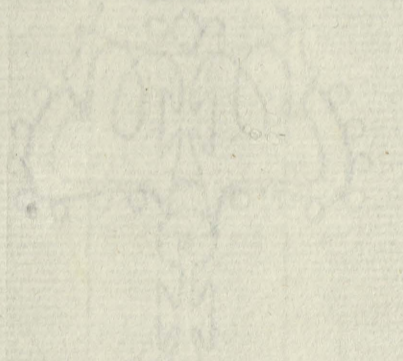
