May 2 Made a very magnificent Antique Lamp with  
30 Spouts each containing a double sized burner  
in a circle of 9<sup>th</sup> diameter, the bottom or bowl of the  
Lamp is decorated with a new rich border or frieze  
8 Inches broad consisting of 10 compartments in one  
of which is a Baso Relievo of a Tyre & in each  
of the other nine a Baso Relievo of one of the Illustrious  
Models after the Antique by Mess<sup>rs</sup> Rossi & Smith  
the spaces between the heads are ornamented with  
rich foliage in the center is a colossal Disk of  
Apollo model'd by Rossi & surrounded with  
Rays, the 30 Spouts are embellish'd on the under  
side with large double Escarthus Leaves & long  
twines and the ends of them with small honey suckle  
and Scroble, the 30 Lights are all distinct Patent  
Fountain Lamps the tubes & burners of which rest upon  
the Spouts and the Reservoir rest upon a circular frame  
divided into 30 compartments which is in the center  
of the Lamp & is conceal'd by a cover with 30 Ribs  
& 30 doors, under the Range of Reservoirs is a hammered  
Copper Lining to prevent any Oil leaking through and  
in each Spout is also a Copper lining to receive  
any Leakage from the burner, the Burners have double  
sized French Chimneys & extra large rough Globes  
or Morns 8<sup>th</sup> diameter, the Lamp is suspended  
by 10 double Link braided Chains (Copper) each seven  
feet long made on purpose & connected at the top  
with large S hooks to a horizontal loop & Ring and  
suspended by a very large S hook the Chains are  
connected to the Lamp by 10 large Chained trade hooks  
The ornamental parts are all Chased in the best manner  
& the whole has been executed according to an original  
drawing submitted & approved of by H. R. H. The Prince  
Regent the middle of last December since when the  
Work



has been incurred in terms for the Dinner given by the Royal  
Academy previous to the opening of the Exhibition by great  
expenses and additional expense & suspended on the 30<sup>th</sup>  
of April in the Great Room of the Royal Academy Somerset  
House by command of H. R. H. communicated to us by

made of Rings 3<sup>d</sup> diameter cast entire that there

Bracket & frame for the Large Chain to travel on . . . . . 10.---
