 stocks to try the sett and range of His Majesty's guns  
 plate in wood case with the Royal Arms engraved  
 fitt. into a mahogany case, with Lock, Key, Hinges &  
 four brass feet at the bottom  
 cutting off the breach ends of two pair of double  
 barrels that broke in proof originally belonged to  
 Bonaparte, false breeched mounting them with  
 best self acting bolt Locks, with improved cocks  
 gold sights, touch holes & pans, the stocks richly  
 inlaid with silver, silver mounted richly chased &  
 gilt, the Locks, false breeches, screws & inlaid with

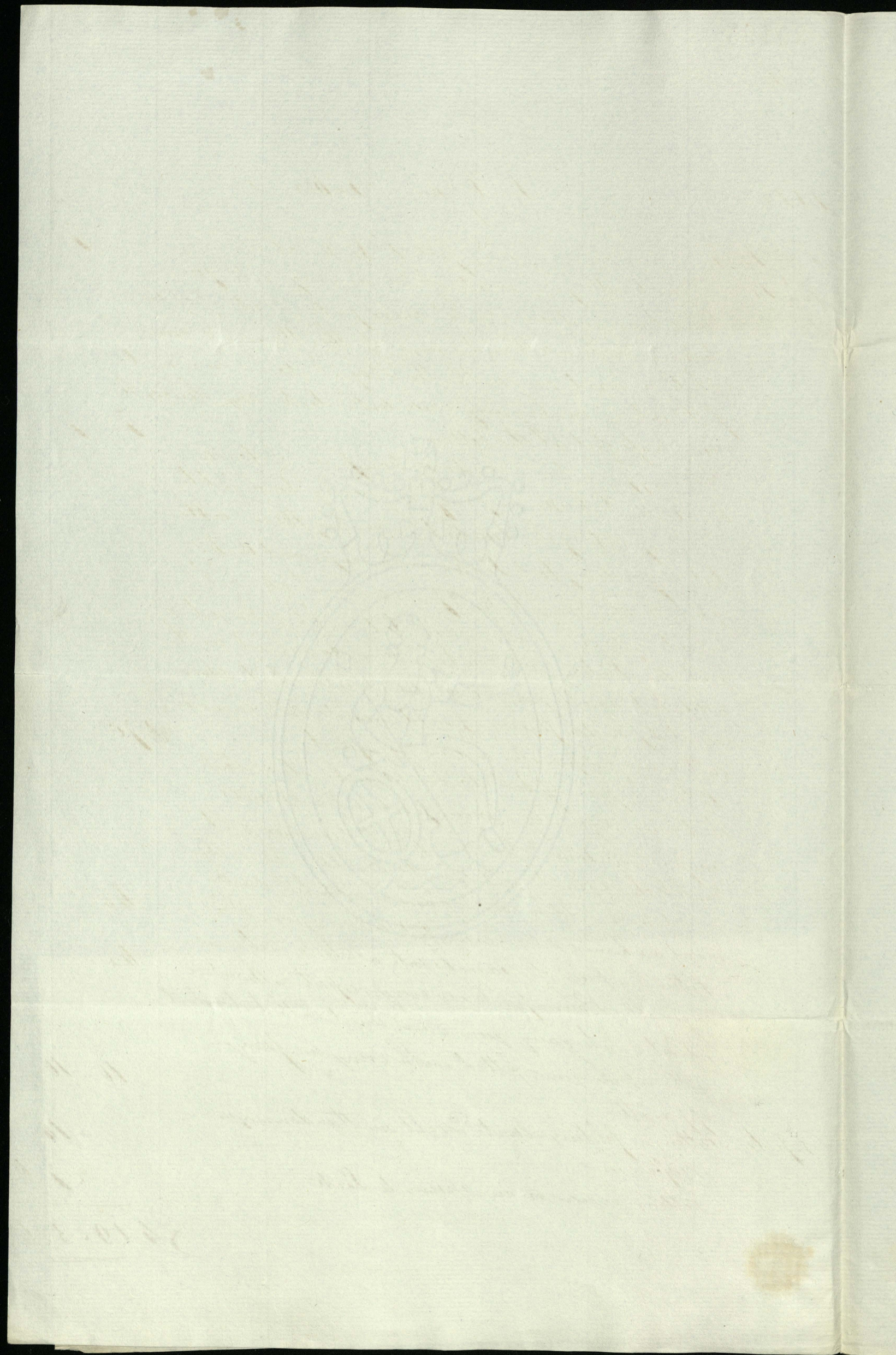
