The Account of Herbert Taylor Esquire Treasurer and Receiver General of the Revenues and Treasurer of the Household to Her Majesty Queen Charlotte being by Her Majesty's Warrant under Her Royal Sign Manual bearing date the Third day of January 1817 Constituted Nominated and Appointed unto the said Offices and Places of Treasurer and Receiver General as by the above recited Warrant may appear That is to say the said Herbert Taylor doth Yield and make this present Account of the several Sums of Money received and had by him out of the Receipt of His Majesty's Exchequer since the said Third day of January 1817. 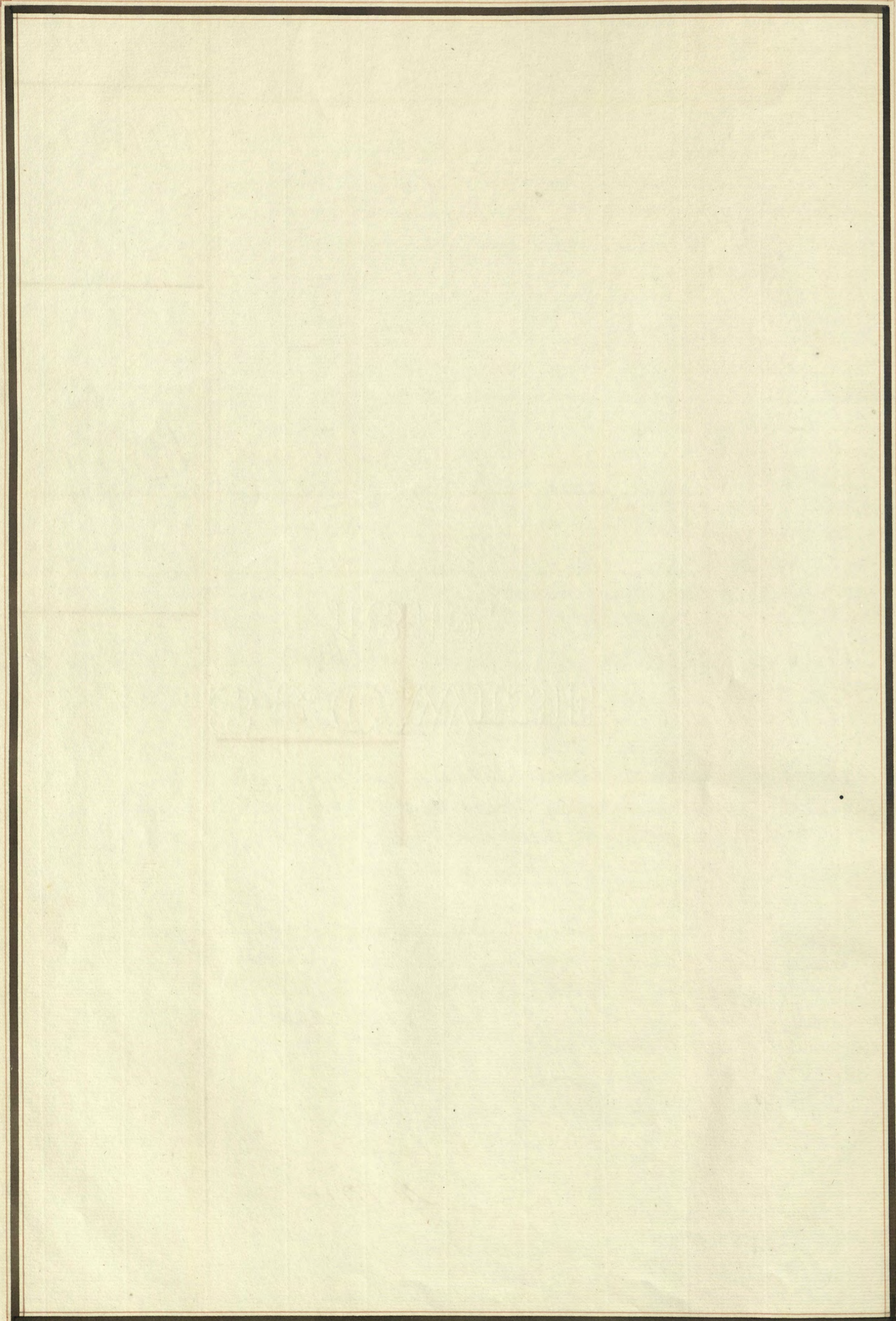
