As the Circumstances of the Establishment of this Office cannot be properly expressed in the Draft accompanying the Order, the following Account is humbly submitted, in which the various particulars required are stated, so far as applicable to the Mint Office.

The Rank of the various Officers, with their Names, are particularly stated below. They hold separate Appointments from His Majesty by Special Commissions of the different dates undernoted. It is well known, that no business has been done in the Mint of Scotland for a considerable period, and none of the Officers have Deputies. The entire Salary, which is paid by an Issue from the Exchequer through the hands of the Master and the Proportions paid to each Officer (there being no separate Emoluments) are under noted, and the total and Net Receipt for 1797, with the deductions, described. The Annual Receipt suffers no Alteration, so that there has been no increase or diminution since 1782.

By Act of 7<sup>th</sup> Ann. Cap. 28 & 3, which is made perpetual by Act 9<sup>th</sup> George 3<sup>rd</sup> Cap. 25. The Lord Treasurer is authorized to issue from the Exchequer £1200 for the purposes therein mentioned.

M. John Baker (an Ag<sup>t</sup> of James Meyrick Esq<sup>r</sup>) was appointed to this office in March 1798 through the recommendation of M. Courtts.

His Majesty, by His Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the 17<sup>th</sup> was pleased to grant to Gen<sup>l</sup> Gardiner a Pension of £600 p<sup>a</sup> Annum, to commence from the 5<sup>th</sup> Jan<sup>y</sup> 1798 — payable Quarterly at the Excheq<sup>r</sup> — subject to the usual Deductions. — which Pension the General assign'd over to M<sup>r</sup> Coult's by an Instrument dated

Pensions of this description, however, being four Quarters in Arrear, and no payment likely to be made on Gen<sup>l</sup> Gardiner's till about April 1799 — and then most probably only for the Quarter ended 5<sup>th</sup> of April 1798 — the General found it could not tend to extricate himself from his Difficulties at Warsaw (where he has been obliged to remain since His Appointments as Envoy Extra<sup>o</sup> to the late King of Poland ceased 5 July 1795) arising from Debts incurred there. He therefore proposed to relinquish his Pension entirely, if Government would advance him immediately £2000 — This Proposition was communicated by M<sup>r</sup> Coult's to Lord Grenville, H. M's Secretary of State for the Foreign Department, who had been instrumental in obtaining the Pension for Gen<sup>l</sup> Gardiner — and M<sup>r</sup> Coult's at same time represented to His Lordship the cruel Situation of the General, in being detained at Warsaw, and thereby prevented from deriving those benefits from his Military Profession, which he would enjoy, if liberated, and returned to this Country. — Lord Grenville, however, said the Proposal for relinquishing His Majesty's Pension was inadmissible; but feeling for the General's Situation, he offered his interference with the Minister to obtain an Advance from the Treasury to Gen<sup>l</sup> Gardiner of £2000 (the sum required) to be repaid by Installments of £300 a year out of his

his Pension beforementioned. — This Offer was readily accepted by Mr Couths, as Assignee of the Pension, and was at length accomplished by a Sign Manual of His Majesty's bearing date the 25 Sept. 1798, directing the Sum of £2000 to be issued to Genl Gardiner from the Civil List together with 132..5 to satisfy the fees on receiving the same. —

The Lords of the Treasury having in consequence required a Letter from Mr Couths, engaging to repay the Money by Installments out of the Pension, as had been agreed upon, the following is a Copy of the Letter granted, vizt. —
