To Brother

Last week I had the pleasure of your most kind entertainment letter, by the silly fool, who comes here after Prince Ferdinand, & in an amus how she wishes to have it thought that she is his mistress, but no one will let her honor to believe it, if this King of Prussia is inclined to the English, I shall not lament his late Prussian Majesty's death, for it was generally believed that his predecessor hated us with an envious Eye - now he is dead people will not be afraid to give their opinion, he was certainly a great king but — he is dead, & the Duke who bears his best respects desire me to assure you that there is not a word of truth about the ring, he left him low saddle Horsco & Hongri win, & it much easier to serve this to them the last, the duke he is very good to remember me if she knew me I flattered myself she would prefer me to any of her sisters in law I am very glad to hear that you are well with the P of W may it last as long as I wish, & his affection in sending his Physician makes me very happy, as a child he was my favorite he had the most feeling & he has a good heart by what I have heard, do not forget a sister that loves you with all her heart believe me dear brother
