Dear Brother

To p'd. from right to left we are now at Hannover, the Duke & my self would rather have wish'd that P. Malmesbury had prefer'd Bronsvic for her residence, his reasons must be well grounded & that has stop'd our mouth. Prince Ernest is writing to the Queen, & I believe making a very favorable Picture of my daughter, she has figure & grace which with her affability gains tous les coeurs, her courage surpasses every thing, at Osnabruck she had a Tooth pull'd out, by a man she had never see before, since that all pain is over & she hopes for a thaw that at last she can be at your feet. god knows what will become of us, we intend going to subside if they take the road to Osnabruck, but I hope that Holland will satisfy them. Amst'rdam will repent their facility in opening their gates to those Jacobins, the news from Holland is certainly very alarming, we know nothing of the Princess of Orange, but that she has left the Hague. I have writte to thank her for all the relays she had plac'd, & the great expence they were at Southeyk she sent us to Lakes. I ever am dear brother
