Having now dear brother completed
my plan of staying with my Daughter till
she had reach'd those that you thought pro-
per to intrust her with. I look ~~my~~ my mission
being at an end. if my health would have
permitt'd it, I could not have ~~with~~ resist'd the
tears of my dear Girl, & the intreats of the
Duke which she had got of her side, eight
days of continual travelling, in bad roads.
would quite have over set me. at Osna bruch
I was oblig'd to stay some days longer that
the fatigue might not be too much for me.
in short the Coach brings on a Complaint that
is very troublesome, & that makes me suffer
exceedingly, & I am persuaded that I can be of
no use to her any longer. She supports herself
with great courage in this trying conflict
between the parting with her friends, & the

great prospect of grandeur that waits
for her. I have taken the liberty to
write to the Prince that he must be
responsible for the first impression the
the Public will form of my dear dear ch
as she only wishes to know what is thought
proper for her to do & I am very sure that
she is very ready to obey. Lord Malmesbury
has finish'd his mission with great pro-
prietly. I am much oblig'd to him for his
wise & prudent advice I ever am dear
