Lady Sur: Gover to H. R. H. the Hered: Princed of Brunswick
Wolffenbüttel
Sunbridg-wells July 26th 1769.

I am rejoiced to hear, that You are well, and not a little happy to see by the New papers that You are preparing for Your English journey. I wish I could flatter myself with being able to go into Germany to conduct G. R. H. home, but at present I am quite a poor weak creature. The shock the news of D. Hamiltons death and the anxiety that I have been in ever since about the Dutches has hurt me very much. I have ~~not~~ not been able to go out of airing but twice since. Lord Gover was obliged to leave me about some business. I cannot tell G. R. H. any news from hence, for I have not been at the walsi nor rooms.

Lady Spencier and Miss Floyd and Lady Jane Maccartney some times call upon me, but I am so grieved about the Dutches that I have no pleasure in seeing any body but my own husband

who feels all I suffer, and overlooks all my weaknesses. You dont know him the least in the world I remember You once telling me, that he could not love well - He can - I assure You, and I know, the goodness of G. A. H. heart will make You rejoice to know him, but do not answer this paragraph for I never told him, that You had such a Idea La belle Veuve has left Dutches of Hamilton.

I believe, she is with Lady Mary Lowther in the North. Lord Bute is returned, I was assur'd, if I was glad - the truth is, that I do not care, whether he is here, or there, or any where. I only wish him to be, where is most for the Kings advantage and happiness, for I do not believe there is any creature more thoroughly attached to His Majesty than my self.

Does not the Princess Augusta come with G. A. H. I hope she does, but I am afraid she has forgot - Milady. Pray my best Compliments to the Princess
