I am quite ashamed to have forgot for two days to give your letters to the King, I thought it was better to own my fault, than that he should tell you, as he said he would. there will go to England in a short time a Courier by whom I shall write, the letter that I was to have received in England from Madame de Plese I received after I had left Altona, there was nothing in it but compliments, and Bothman knew not how to excuse the not having given it me. you remember what I said of her from Altona, she is not what I took her for, and I think that she has been of some service to me, by giving me a few peoples characters.
