 rest of the furniture are to be placed. I understand



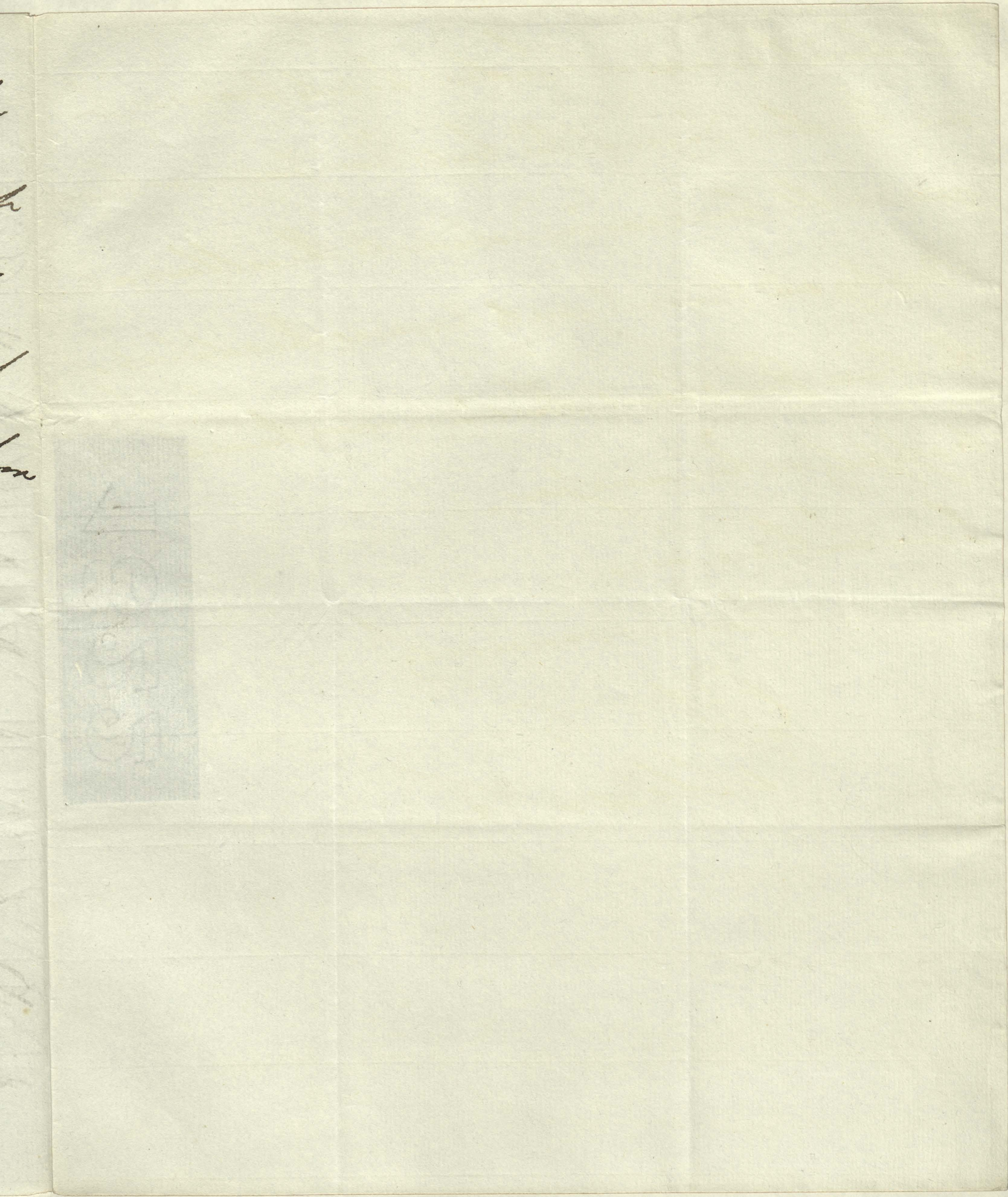
