with their families except, particular instance.

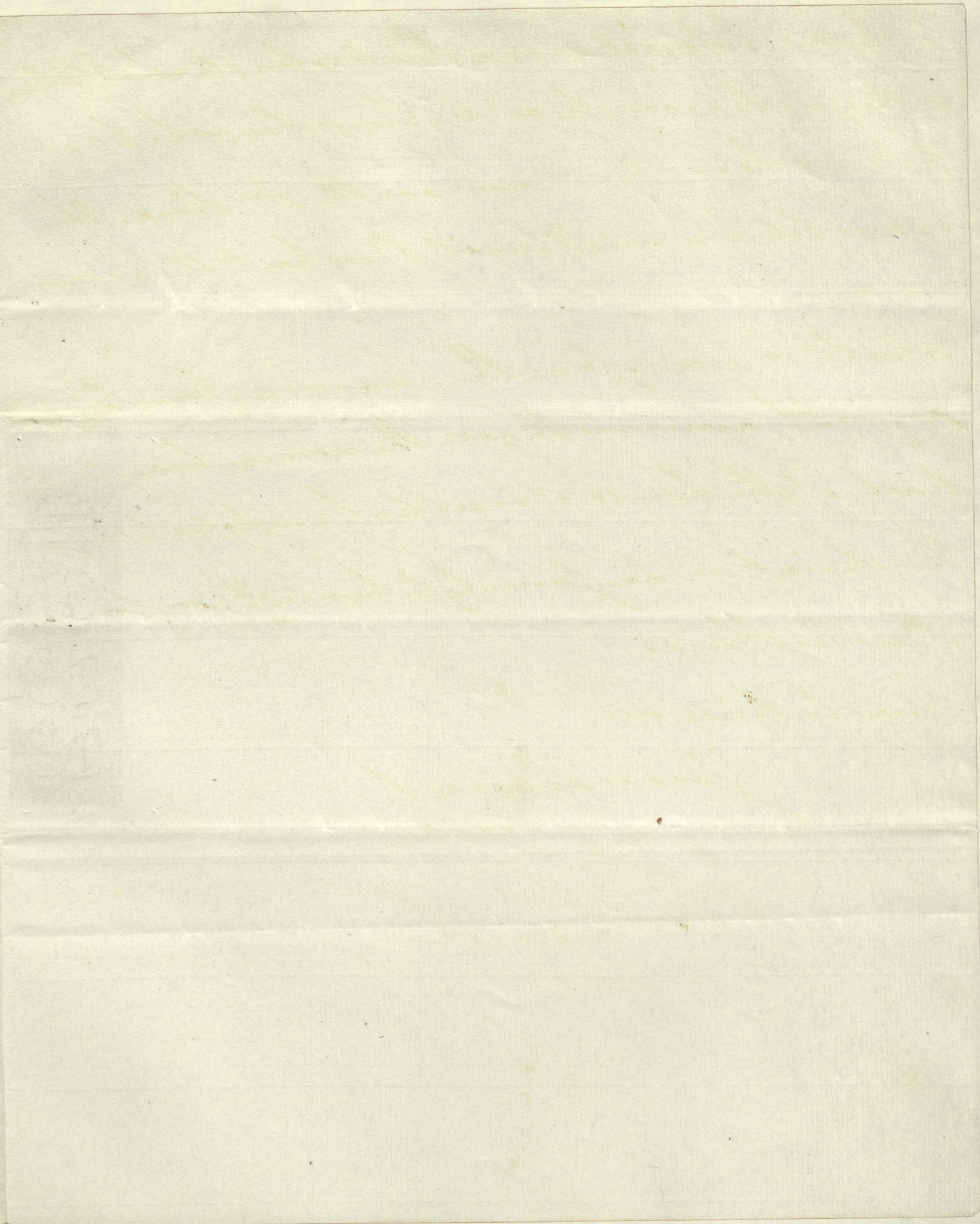
