Dear Brother,

I was exceedingly concerned to hear

from Thate yesterday that owing to an indisposition of yours he was

Obliged to proceed to Brighton. I hope you will not think me offi-

-cious in sending over a servant with this to enquire after your

health. I pray I can send him but till tomorrow that I may

know what sort of rest you will have had tonight.

I pray thanks my dear Brother for

your kindly allowing Thate to come here in his way: it was more

particularly agreeable his visit yesterday as the day of my discharge -
-ment was settled which shall be after ten weeks to be in place on
Sunday.

I was very sorry to learn that Mr. Pitt's health was become indis-
posed: I sincerely hope she is much better: my best wishes and con-
-fidently attend her: the King has likewise wrote to the Duke
of York to forbid his returning till Parliament have made the
settlement: this cannot please Frederick.
