My dear Brother

We are all quite concerned to hear that you have met with another accident—especially as your poor leg has received a fresh wound—The King has spoke in the highest terms of last Friday's review—he told all the Gentlemen that the Regiment had done amazingly well—that they did stand Exercise better than ever he had seen it done before—and that as for the riding, he approved greatly of them not having rode too fast for that they shew'd clearly by what they had done, that they sat remarkably well—All these things I spok'd for you hoping to have seen you Yesterday—but that pleasure being Defied, I must trouble you with a few lines—Dear Amelia is quite contented with the arrangement for her journey—I know how happy I could make her by the great & general approbation the 10th met with on Friday and I told her all the particulars

great quantity of Hot Grains - Dinner is just
