June 25 1793

My Dearest Brother

I had not an opportunity
 when I saw You last of putting You in mind that
 Your Dear Picture has been so long promised to
 me - and that You are of a jealous temper
 cannot bear to have a Copy or any other than
 the very one You shew'd me - I intend for the
 rest of my life - to be very despotick till I have
 a Lord and Master - and then for life I break
 the great Oaths and promises I shall make
 when I marry / I shall give my self up to his
 Whims - I shall take advantage of Your kindness
 and not be so obedient to You in appearance
 but my heart would sooner direct me to do as You
 bid me even if I were induty bound to obey
 somebody else - I believe You must think me
 crazy to write You such a letter but tho' I am an

impetuous & eager - think but a moment what
it is that I beg for, and then you will grant my
petition. - I long to see you again for but these
days visit was a very uncomfortable one - I hope
you was able to keep Williams from the House of
Lords - I have never asked if he was there - for his
speech has read some of our friends very much
tho' they have not named it - Adieu My Dear
Brother I need not add to you how sincerely
