

Windsor Castle Oct. 4th 1817

My Dear Brother

I am commended by the Queen with her
 brother to inform you, that after having tried every thing about the
 Bath you has recommended to remove the inconvenience she has so long
 find with from her stomach, and that nothing has been thought of more
 than temporary relief she has at last consented to try the Bath Waters -
 and therefore until she had named it to her Council and made her arrange-
 ments with them she would not mention to any body.

Early in November is the time that she is leaving us by the
 and she would remain there such a length of time as not to hinder her
 when taking the Waters, therefore she says that happy as she always is
 to visit you, she would give up the pleasure of going to Brighton
 for this year, as it will be necessary for her to keep quiet for some
 time after her return home - You will receive a letter from

Sir Henry Hallford to enquire of you with their circumstances and see
them on Monday in London -

she respecting the Council being present with their self -
