

Windsor Castle  
15 February 1820  
1/2 past 11 p m.

Sir

His Royal Highness the  
Commander in Chief has been  
pleas'd to direct that  
guns shall be fired tomorrow  
at the rate of one gun  
every five minutes from  
eight o'clock tomorrow  
morning, till the Procession  
for the General, shall begin  
to move which will probably be  
about 9 in the forenoon: con-  
sequently about 13 hours, after  
the firing commences.

The beginning of the Procession  
will be notified by a Rocket  
and from that moment  
till the <sup>funeral</sup> service is completed,  
(which is to be notified by  
another Rocket,) minute

Officers Commanding Royal Artillery & Guns  
at Windsor and adjacent



Ironed Guns liberally  
so termed, viz. one every  
minute are to be fired.

The Place where these Guns  
are to be fired is at or  
near the Double Gates  
which open from the long  
walk into the Great Park  
about one mile or three  
quarters of a mile from  
the Entrance of Windsor.

From the Number of Rounds  
you mentioned which I understood  
to be above 600, I think  
this Service is greatly  
within your Means; should  
I have misunderstood you  
it may be possible to send for  
a Supply against the Evening.

At all Events I have  
to request that you will  
give the necessary Orders  
for



for carrying into effect  
the intention of His Royal  
Highness:
