The Jurisdiction of the Court of
the King's Palace extends into Middlesex,
Herts, Hants, Essex, and Surrey — The Court
is held every Friday in the year, at the
Sessions House in Horse Manger Lane —
has 4 Council and 6 Attorneys, and the
proceedings are in all respects similar
to those in Westminster Hall — Debts from
40 Shillings to any amount recovered,
in actions for Assaults and Trespases, the
smallest Damages will carry Costs — which
are taxable by the prothonotary, and
seldom exceed 6 or 7 pence — Suits gener-
-rally terminated in 6 Weeks, as some
progress must be made every Court
Day — In arrests for Debts, the Plaintiff
is not obliged to search the records for
other Writs against the Defendant.

To find the Interest of any Sum, at
any rate, for any number of Days -

Multiply the Sum, by the rate
and that by the number of Days -
divide by 365.00 for the quotient.

To find ditto at 5 per Cent.

Multiply the Sum by the number
of days, and divide by 7300 for the quotient
