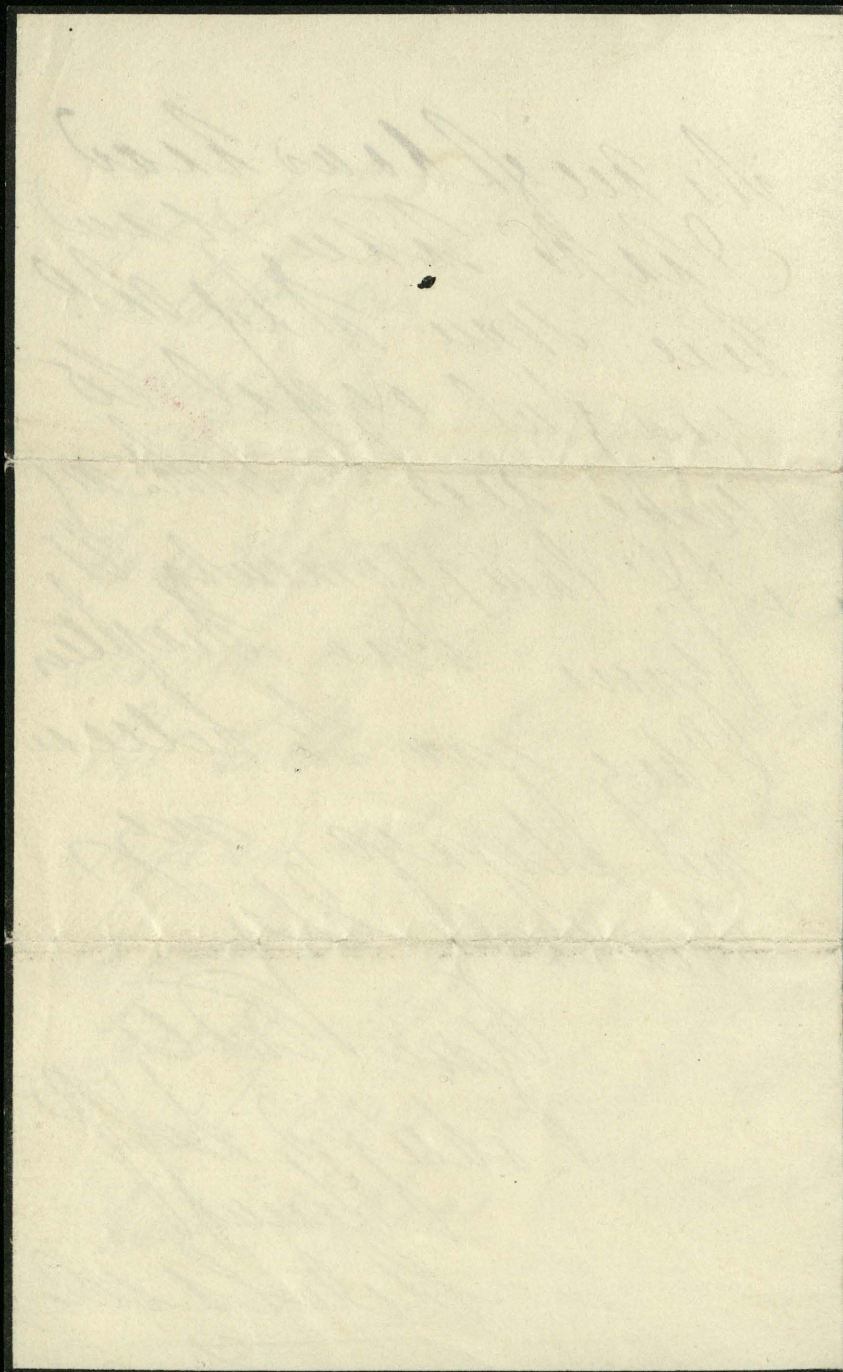
My dear lady I
