

Pneuenzen.

Augth 27: 1819.

My Dear Lord,

I enclose herewith your
and enclosed letter for Your Lordship and Lady Grey
and send them under cover to Great Berlin; you
must have had a copy of this and I hope and know
as Your Lordship does them. I say they late
over departure from there to Pthenkerry we kept
along the Tidla this a beautiful country and arrived
on the Taw with a little before eight at the mouth of
Pthenkerry which stands magnificient on that
river and is a large and comfortable mansion with fine
library. The next morning we went with our hon-
orable friends to their hunting seat Middleton

woods among the mountains having left the river Tschir
and following the course of the river Rose: we spent our time
most agreeably at Wildeck in walking and viewing the
beautiful scenes the ladies riding or a few moments as
the sun's heat would permit: yesterday we took the
"F" the excellent Landgraff and the amiable Landgrave my
advising on the way made Princengrave a long
run: the Dutchess has enjoyed herself amongst the old
familiar relations she found at D. Monbrey and Wil-
dach and now I presume may go to find herself with
her mother and her native place: Friendship
cannot be surprised at the universal satisfaction ex-
pressed by all ranks at the return of the Dutchess
to Princengrave the meeting was very mutual on both
sides: the castle is large and magnificient and the floor on
which we are lodg'd having been taken in a month

To Hall Grange here till the firstt of June next I
trust to be in boord on the sumt return here on the 15th
June and on the 16th arrane with the Dutch ship at
Amsterdam with travel some distance yesterday
arrived to this place and seen a delightful place.
Here I find believe to establish the health of
my excellent and amiable Dutch friends together and to
land here early in September in order to England a
stranger and more robust man than ever: we shall
expect you and the good King at Amsterdam: say
nothing from the Dutch for benevolence to the Gov.
- tiff: my best and sincerest wishes and Compliments
to all your small companions: I have letter from
Africa and Asia from Turkestan and India and my
three daughters equally well & will send
you of Massachusetts: George going to write again in India

with the approbation of Canning: I am tolerably well
and trust the total command of my charge of air will make
me escape my annual attack: but the heat & the dust
and travelling hasten it: God bless you and ever
believe me,
