My Lord

Having had the honour of your Lordship's friend-
ship relative to the favour I have requested of
his Majesty, & your Lordship having mention'd
the name of Mr. Vernon, I take the liberty
of enclosing two letters from Mr. Warburton
which I have found amongst my Father's papers;

Iho' these letters will show your Lordship what
Opinion Mr. Warburton had of the Vernon -
claim, still my whole dependance is upon
your Lordship's good Offices in my Behalf,
& the favour I hope to receive from his
Majesty's kindness towards me.

I need not trouble your Lordship with
speaking how happy I shall be in every
opportunity of convincing your Lordship of
my gratitude for any favour that may
be shewn me, & in exerting my Zeal at all
times in the support of his Majesty's Government.
