Whereas, in pursuance of an Act of Parliament, passed in the Twenty Fourth Year of our Reign, to provide for the Administration of the Government, in Case the Crown should descend to any of the Children of our Son, Frederick, late Prince of Wales, being under the Age of Eighteen Years, and for the Care and Guardianship of their Persons; We did, by three Instruments, under our Royal Sign Manual, nominate, and add Persons, therein named, to the Persons and Officers, by the said Act, appointed to be of the Council of Regency, thereby constituted; Which said three Instruments were made revocable, and sealed up in such Manner, and lodged and deposited, in the Hands of such Persons, as

by the said act are directed; — Now,
We do, by these Presents, and by two
other Instruments, of the same Tenor and
Date, herewith, under our Royal Sign
Manual, revoke, and make void, the
said three Instruments, so formerly
executed by us; and the Nomination,
thereby made, as aforesaid. And
further, in pursuance of the said act, We
do, by these Presents, and by the said two
other Instruments, of the same Tenor and
Date, herewith nominate and add to the Persons
and Officers, by the said act appointed
to be of the said Council of Regency, the
Persons following, being natural-born Subjects
of our Realm of Great Britain; viz:
William D. of Devonshire, James
Earl Waldegrave, Philip Earl of
Hardwick, and Sr Thomas
Robinson Kn^t of the Bath

And We do hereby, and by the two other
Instruments last-mentioned, appoint the said
Persons, herein before-named, to be Members
of the said Council of Regency, according to
the true Intent of the said Act; Reserving
to Ourselves full Power and authority, to
revoke these Presents, and the said two other
Instruments last-mentioned, at Our Will and
Pleasure. Given at Our Court of S^t. James's
the 21. Day of March in the year 1757
and in the thirtieth of our Reign.
