Yearly sum of Thirty & five thousand  
Pounds without Account, the same to  
commence from the tenth day of October  
now last past, and from thence forth  
to

to be payable and paid Quarterly at the  
Four most usual days of Payment in the  
Year by even and equal Portions, for &  
during Our Pleasure. And these our  
Letters shall be your sufficient Warrants  
and Discharge in this Behalf. Given  
under Our Privy Seal at Our Palace of  
Westminster the Twenty Second day of  
December in the thirty third Year of our  
Reign.
