

57073 In the act s^r Georgii for regranting to his majesty, for the support of his household and of the honour and dignity of his crown, all branches and revenues, which were settled on the late Queen for that purpose, there is contained the following exceptions -

Pag: 6 . . . Except the duty of 4 and $\frac{1}{2}$ p cent, the Revenue of the Duchy of Cornwall and the Revenues of the 1st fruits and tenths of the clergy.

And except such revenues, rents and hereditaments as have been granted or passed to any person or persons, bodys Politick or Corporate by and in pursuance of any act or acts of Parliament in that behalf.

And except all charges on the said revenues or any of them made by any acts of Parliament whatsoever.

Pag: 9 . . . with a saving to all persons, other than the King, of all Rights, Titles, Estates, customs, Interest, claims and demands whatsoever out of the Revenues so regranted or any of them, as they or any of them had at the making of that act.

Pag: 287 . . . In the said act for settling the aggregate Fund there is granted to his Maj^y an additional Revenue of 120000 p ann: which together with the net produce of g^e revenues before regranted were to make up g^e clear yearly sum of 700000 for g^e service of his Maj^y household and family and other his necessary expences and occasions.

Pag: 307 . . . In the same act there is contained a Proviso, that if the Revenues so settled shall from M^{ich}as 1715 produce in clear money more than g^e yearly sum of 700000, that g^e overplus shall go to g^e aggregate Fund till all g^e Exchequer bills thereby provided for shall be paid off; and g^e overplus then after arising shall not be issued, disposed or applied to any use without authority of Parliament, and that all grants and dispositions made by His Majesty of such overplus or any part thereof without authority of Parliament shall be void, and g^e Grantees or other persons, to whom such grants or dispositions shall be made, shall be adjudged incapable in law to take, hold, keep, detain or enjoy g^e same.

Pag: 308 . . . It is also provided that If all g^e revenues so settled taken together shall at g^e end of any year successively from M^{ich}as 1715 during his Maj^ys life appear to have produced in clear Money less than 700000, then such deficiency shall be provided for, answered and made good by and out of g^e next aids to be granted in Parliament.

Whether upon Construction of g^e aforesaid acts and g^e Savings therin contained The grants in Fee or for lives or years made by any of his Maj^yes Predecessors and now payable out of his Maj^yes Civil list revenues ought to be imputed as part of g^e 700000 so appropriated for g^e support of his household and g^e honour and dignity of g^e Crown. which Grants are on g^e other side -
