And as Marshall Lord Legonier, has not only given me his leave, but even justified my laying the inclosed Memorial at His Majesty's feet, it is to your Lordship's knowne, labour, that I trust to, for a gracious reading from His Majesty. And as my case is knowne to many of your Lordships Friends, <sup>I hope</sup> it may prompt you to read it. And then it will be to your Lordship alone, I shall owe my future happiness, as the deliverer of a Soldier, who tho' so very clearly exculpated, to his Judges, has been so scandalously ill treated. Now if to say one half of what I am conscious your Lordship deserves, I should be suspected of flattery; which I sincerely do not mean. The Justice and Humanity you have ever shewn are the only pretensions I claim to your Lordships protection and forgiveness for this liberty. And have the Honour to be With great respect
