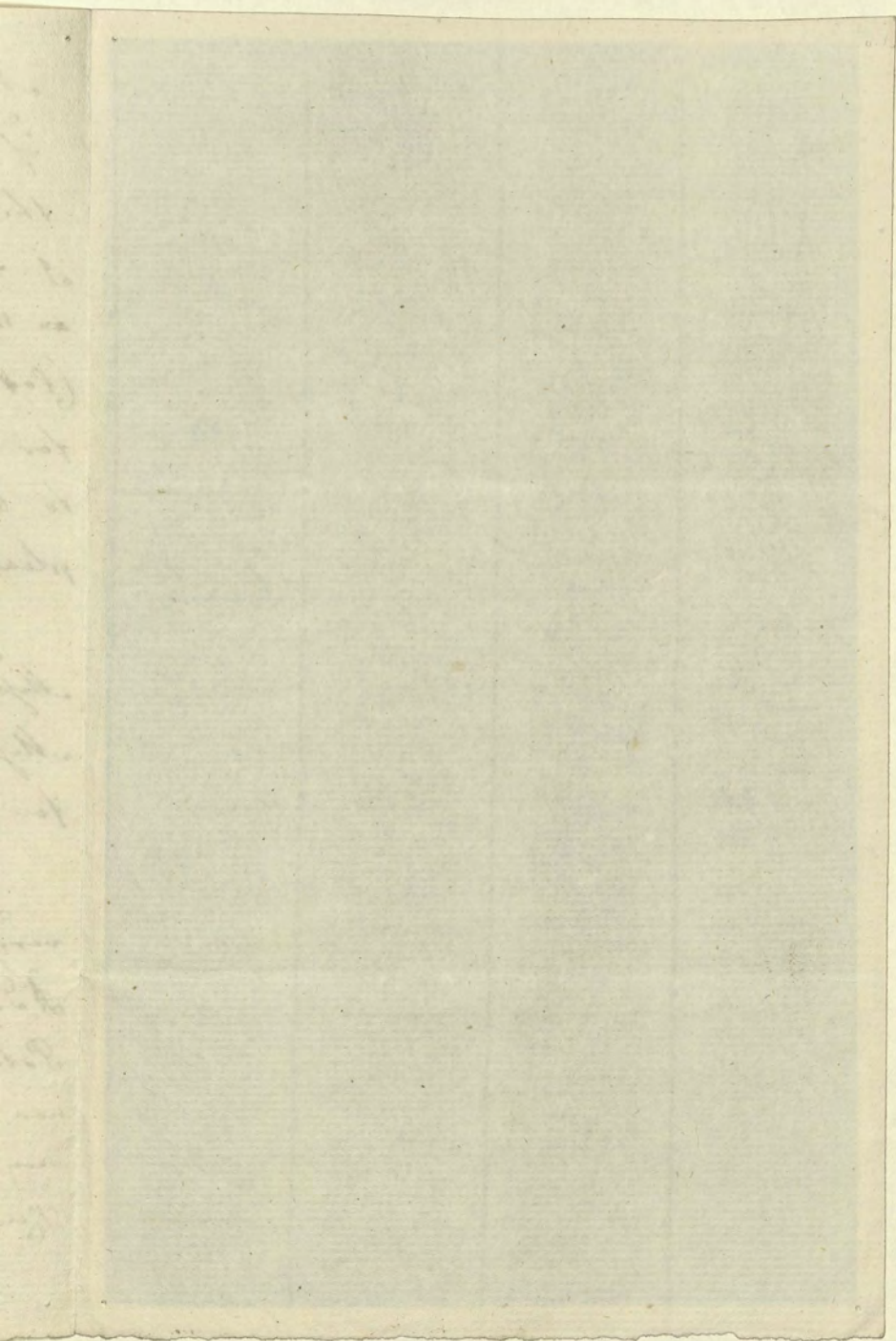
My dear Lady Charlotte Finch.
