Dear Daniell, Yours L^o: 53 has this moment reached me and I have as usual signed the paper: as for the claims of the Farmer for perquisites on the sheep hills it must be a matter of consideration when I return which will be now about six weeks: with the regulations I cannot at present determine whether usually to hall the hill or sell my sheep: the more grassland the Farmer can feed the better: I hope I shall see my names and without separating you and Barton he may be kept in order: but I am afraid he prospers every thing to his own advantage: no doubt but the breed must be improved and may be

watched: I certainly intend all the servants except
 those in the stables to be on horse keeping: Mr Jamis
 which is kept by the Prince Regent is no precedent
 for the establishment to be kept by one and all
 -ances at Hannover are not to be brought forward
 in England: I suppose altogether of your deserv-
 -ms: great irregularity must have existed about
 the milk and as for as the skin milk is concerned I have
 not and shall not have any objection: but as to
 -ularly at present I cannot admit of the Germans
 having any thing but skin milk: indeed except
 Holliman under proper restrictions and quantity
 and Pr^{ss} milk should be issued but skin
 milk to any of the servants: I am afraid great ex-
