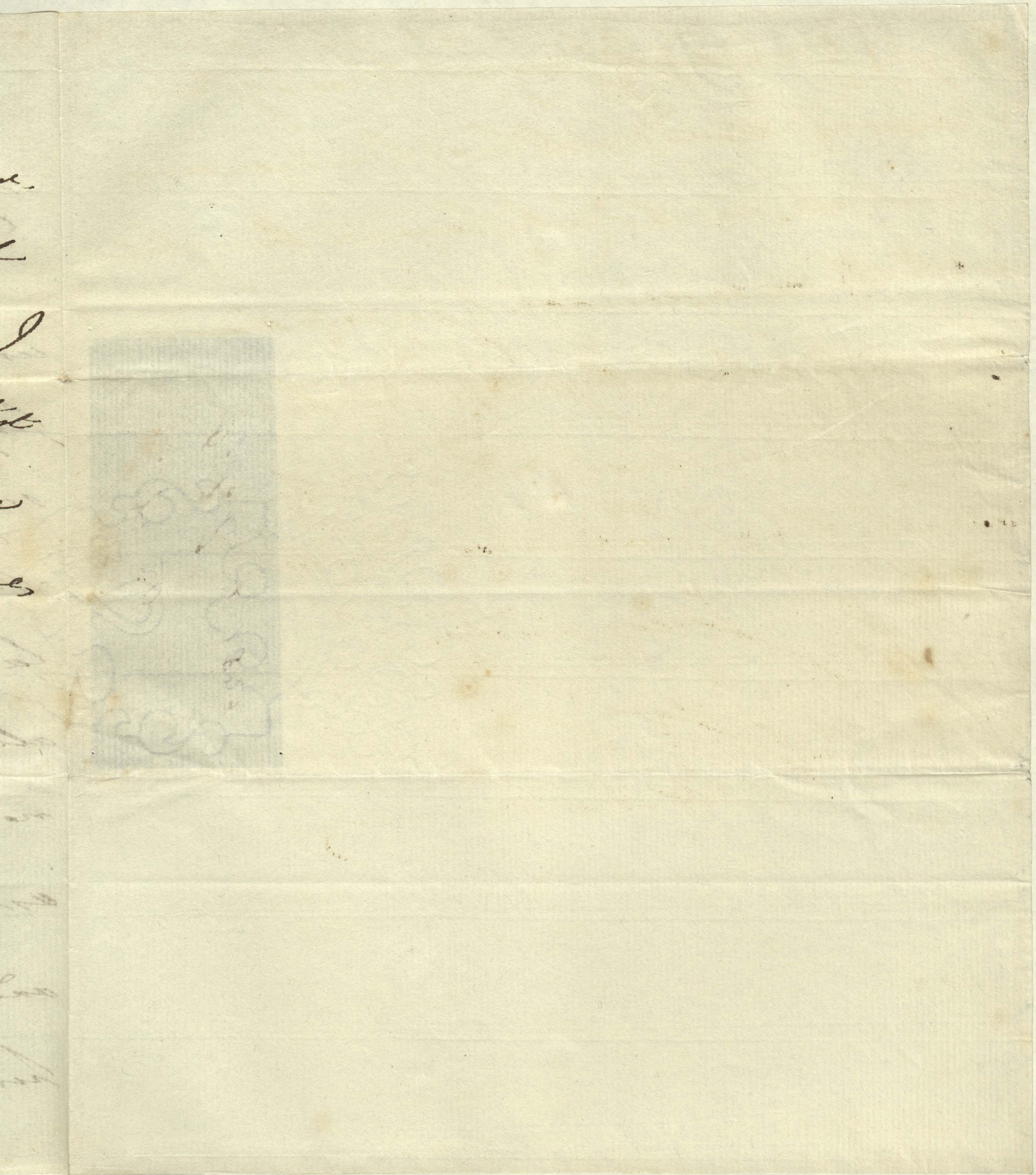
Dear Sir,
