The post is in again today  
 and no letters from you. My last was <sup>the</sup> 28<sup>th</sup> April.  
 You must therefore find on the receipt of this your  
 self to tender and fully explain to Legge that  
 your more private to me is not to be  
 put up with the newspapers but sent to the  
 Foreign Office as a letter by itself.

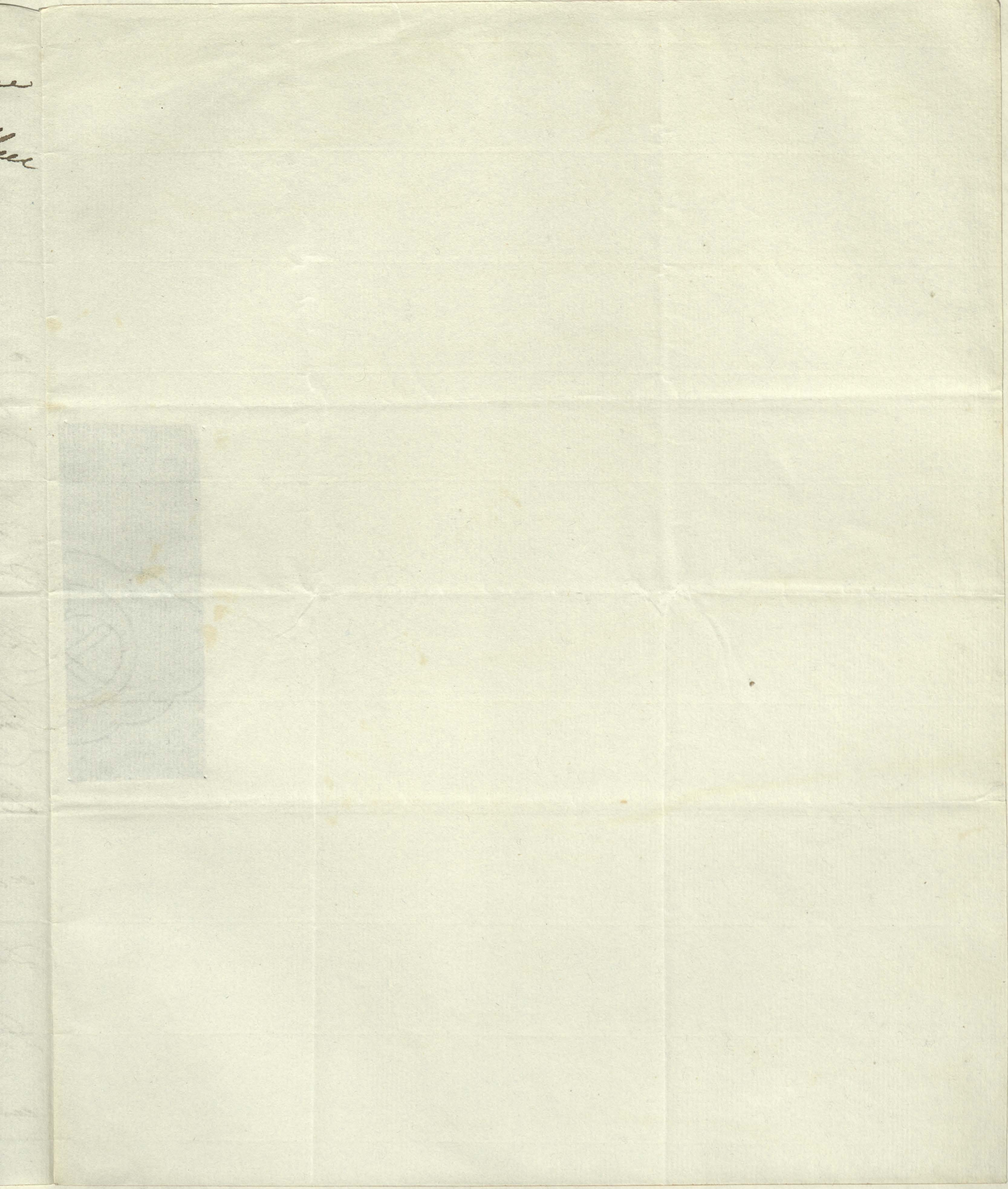
I have not any thing to write about the trusts  
 all is going on well and very lively at Busby.

During my journey to this place from Speyer  
 I have seen three or four fine and plenty of wheat  
 and never saw more promising crops. They were

already meeting Deane and Hay. I am for this time  
of the year particularly well and we shall see  
how the month of June will agree with me.
