of the Approaching Drawing Room

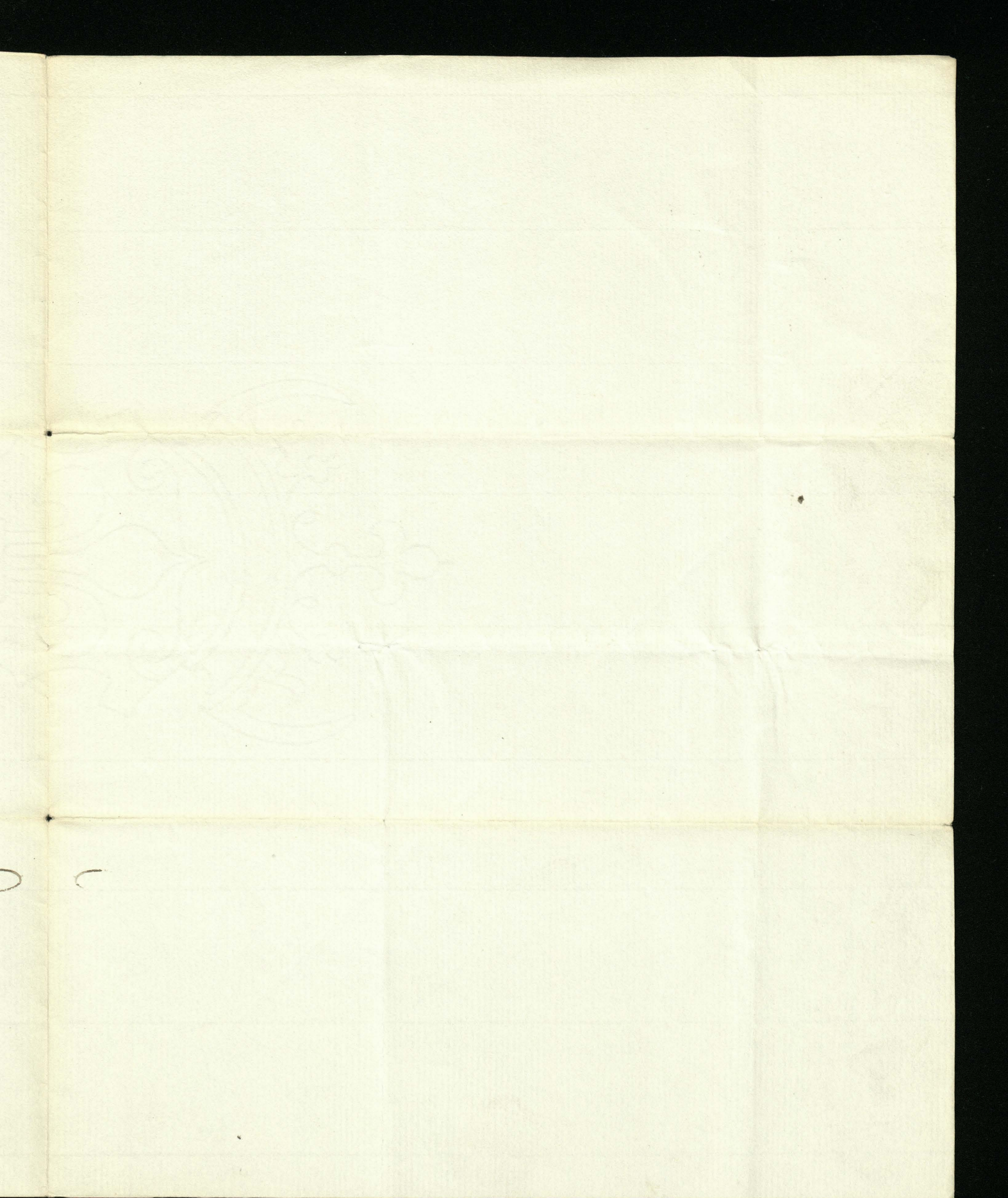
