Letter

Burke House.
April 15: 1812.

Dear Sirs,

I am to acknowledge your Lordship's letter of instant and trust the same will be made to your wishes: I perfectly agree with your Lordship that Mr. John Simpson and Polemore right in their statement about provisions on our side of the water and I can believe the crop of Potatoes has not been raised: I rejoice to hear your Lordship's part of the water is quiet: the it is not a bad thing to have a good and well regulated body of troops near me: I have not any fears for Ireland if we

can only keep the French from landing during their
war in the sister Kingdom and I really think with
more common attention Ireland perfectly secure from
invasion: still however I hope not many years will
elapse before all religious distinctions done away
in the Empire: I remaind Ld Llandaff in politics
to be of the sentiments of Lord's election and charle-
mont: Your Lordship's self ought therefore to press the
Duke of Richmond to remise and I cannot
see how you can be refused and at the same time to
secure the promise of the government and castle
for the first money: tomorrow I dine with Lord
Pingall at Sandwich: but as the Catholic question is
