My Dear Lord,
Yesterday I received your Lord-
-ship's letter of the 14th instant and understand you
remain in Ireland till December: the death
of the Queen will prevent my leaving this
till into December and I must be very sorry that you
and Lady Mary cannot present at it as it
will be a fine thing: Frankfurt is decidedly
the best road and I must get Bassfeld's mile
going on the proper route: Lonsingen and
myself must arrange where your Lordship
is to lodge: I myself the Countess and my
-niece will if we are not with you.

Your Lordship remains longer in Ireland
she writes in the most grateful terms of the
kindness and goodness she experiences from
her excellent friends in Blenheim. I am
never more most particularly and warmly
y to the world: the best they deserve her
