As for publick news, we are miserably off: no provisions and every few men: both officers and men were killed with great spirit: I would not express my thanks to Mr. Baird and Mr. Thomas Byard for their attentions: by carrying and various other methods of a few hundred st. of sheep: however they are very willing to be recommended in Mr. Gages's the general's army: I was not here for any account: Monday, April

got to say with my brother of his and their completion at Vienna
who together with his family begt. be remembered. Last night I
followed them, perhaps my Godfather and Godmother were
not recovered and retired into the arms of a Charles French, whose
whose breath was impregnated with gin and S. Lucca. The next
day I dedicated to my duty: so that I have not much time to
spare. My best compliments to Frederick: know one he
shall hear from me: remember ^{me} to all your friends both male
and female and ever believe me,
